A Letter from the Co-Chairs

In 2018 the FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy **Agents of Change** program was formed with the goal of promoting safer communities in Anchorage and Alaska. About the FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy Alumni Association

The FBI Citizens Academy operates in all FBI field offices. It is designed to give business and community leaders an inside look at FBI investigative techniques and procedures. It allows citizens to undertake activities consistent with expressed FBI priorities.

The FBI National Citizens Academy and each of the local FBI Citizens Academy chapters, such as the one in Alaska, are private non-profit corporations, associated with, but not part of the FBI. Their members promote safer communities through community service projects and education programs for business, labor, media, medical, minority, religious, government, senior citizens and other community leaders about law enforcement. There is a particular emphasis on the mission, resources and limitations of the FBI.

The goals of the FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy Alumni Association include providing members with resources, training, information and technical assistance supporting the use of best practices, priorities and the mission of the FBI; educating local communities about federal law enforcement issues and challenges; participating in activities with the local Special Agent In Charge which are consistent with FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy Alumni Association priorities and with the mission needs of the FBI.

Community Programs

FBI Citizens Academy AK Division

Students gain insight into the structure and operation of an FBI field office and the services the FBI gives to local and state law enforcement agencies. Graduates are encouraged to become members of the FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy Alumni Association, a member of the FBI National Citizens Academy Alumni Association.

Teen Academy

Our Teen Academy program allows high school students an opportunity to get a comprehensive look into today's FBI during a 12 to 14-hour block of instruction and demonstrations at a local field office (currently in the Anchorage Police Department (APD) Training Facility). Students are provided with several presentations on topics including what it takes to work for the FBI, what the FBI is doing about crime in Alaska, interviewing techniques, drugs in Alaska, bomb squad, Run, Hide, Fight, what does it take to be a good leader, and more.

Child Internet Safety/Cyber Security (*Take 25* Program)

The *Take 25* campaign is a pledge encouraging families to each take 25 minutes to talk to a child about safety. This campaign highlights the cooperative efforts among federal, state, and local agencies to prevent, enforce, and prosecute crimes of exploitation against children. The *Take 25* campaign was created in 2007 by the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC). This campaign encourages parents to take 25 minutes to talk to their children about safety and ways to prevent abduction.

Community Outreach Hot Topic Programs

The FBI Alaska CAAA Community Outreach Hot Topic Programs play an important role in the FBI's efforts to educate our community about the unique and ever changing threats faced in Alaska. These targeted programs are chosen based on current events and community needs.

Student Leadership Scholarships

The FBI Anchorage CAAA will develop three (3) \$1,000 scholarships that will be awarded to high school seniors who will be continuing their education in the field of criminal justice, law enforcement or forensic science. Selection parameters will include GPA, leadership skills, community activities and essay submission.

Hometown Heroes

The FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy Hometown Heroes Awards give community recognition in four categories: Safety Forces, Citizen, Community Leader Hero and Unsung Hero. Nominations are accepted for individuals, groups and organizations.

Collaborative Programs

The FBI Alaska CAAA collaborates and partners with many other local law enforcement associations. As a non-profit Alumni Association, the FBI Alaska CAAA hopes to provide funds to assist these organizations to fulfill their respective missions, which focus on making our community safer. The budget covers financial assistance to other local non-profit law enforcement organizations in achieving their mission of making the community safe.

National Crisis Response Canines Project Support

The National Crisis Response Canines organization is rooted in the 1998 school shooting at Thurston High School in Oregon, where two students were killed and 25 injured. In the aftermath, handlers and therapy dogs went into the school to comfort students, said Connie Jantzen, the organization's executive director. Their mission is to harness the power of the human + canine bond to inspire resilience and recovery in people affected by crisis, trauma or disaster, and the responders who help them. When someone is hurting, National Crisis Response Canine Teams are trained to provide **safe**, **compassionate support** to people affected by crisis.

Campaign Benefits

The FBI Anchorage CitizensAcademy Alumni Association recognizes that community trust is an established and highly honored relationship between an agency and the citizens it has been entrusted to serve. This relationship is vital to protecting individuals, the community and national security.

The FBI Anchorage CitizensAcademy Alumni Association is uniquely situated to work alongside the FBI and other law enforcement agencies to develop and execute innovative programming. The high quality and relevant programs that the fund will create as a result of this campaign will enable us to continue to provide programs that foster trust and deliver vital information to the community.

Campaign Goals

The FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy Alumni Association has been funding its programs annually, using membership dues and donations from concerned individuals and corporations within the community. To build upon our success and to be positioned to provide the highest quality programming, the Board of Directors has committed to a \$25,000.00 annual **Agents of Change** Community Outreach Fund Campaign.

The **Agents of Change** Campaign will provide resources for the FBI Anchorage Citizens Academy Alumni Association to fund its Community Outreach Programs for the next five to ten years. This will allow annual membership dues to be used to create scholarships for students interested in a career in law enforcement and to design new and exciting programs addressing the ever-changing needs of our community.

The funds raised by the **Agents of Change** Campaign will provide the resources necessary to create programing to achieve the following goals:

- Act as force multipliers for the Federal Bureau of Investigation
- Promote and initiate affiliations between community members and law enforcement
- Assist in the development and implementation of the FBI Citizens Academy and its local alumni chapter
- Build a network of citizen leaders who are supportive of law enforcement
- Initiate and encourage safer communities and civic engagement in all aspects of promoting safety throughout Anchorage and Alaska
